I am excited to share with you CorpsAfrica's 2016 Annual Report. It was a successful year for CorpsAfrica with Volunteers serving in three countries. The Exchange Program was off to a great start with several Moroccan Volunteers serving in Senegal and Malawi.

We continued to grow our model of recruiting university-educated Africans to serve as Volunteers in rural, high-poverty communities in Morocco, Senegal, and Malawi. Using Human-Centered Design, they identified complex needs in education, health, water, business development, and more, and facilitated small-scale, high-impact projects in agriculture, education, health, infrastructure, etc., to address those needs. The Volunteers integrated successfully into their communities by living with host families, learning local customs and language, and participating in daily activities. They became changemakers by listening to and building the capacity of local people.

Thanks to a tremendous investment by OCP Group and many other supporters, CorpsAfrica is promoting sustainable development across and between North Africa and Sub-Saharan Africa. It is a great honor to empower young Africans to help their countries overcome poverty and trust in their own future. Together we can create a model for national and Pan-African service and participatory, collaborative and accountable community development across Africa.
