Dear Friends,

I am excited to share with you CorpsAfrica's second Annual Report. 2017 was a successful year for CorpsAfrica with 52 Volunteers serving in three countries. The Exchange Program grew as well, with Moroccan Volunteers serving in Senegal and Malawi, Malawians serving in Senegal, and Senegalese serving in Malawi.

We continued to expand the model of recruiting university-educated Africans to serve as volunteers in rural, high-poverty communities in Morocco, Senegal, and Malawi. Volunteers were trained in Human-Centered Design, a problem-solving technique and structure to facilitate the identification complex needs in education, environmental conservation, health, potable water and irrigation, business development, and more. The Volunteers integrated successfully into their communities by living with host families, learning local customs and language, and participating in daily activities. They created change by implementing demand-driven sustainable projects in agriculture, education, health, infrastructure, and more.

It is a great honor to give young Africans the chance they deserve to lead Africa's development. Together we can create a model for national and Pan-African service and participatory, collaborative and accountable community development across Africa.
